Forget **Bronson Arroyo**, we want to hear **Daisuke Matsuzaka's** CD. EMI Music Marketing announced yesterday that it's releasing "Music From the Mound," a compilation of Dice-K's favorite tunes. The album will include one original track, "Gyro Ball," which will feature former J.Geils harmonica player **Magic Dick**, former Extreme guitarist **Nuno Bettencourt**, and NESN announcers **Don Orsillo** and **Jerry Remy**. (Dice-K does not sing or perform on the album.) "I enjoy a wide variety of music, especially rock, hip - hop and R&B," Matsuzaka said in a statement. "I am excited to share my favorite inspirational songs with everyone in Red Sox Nation and beyond." ### Callahan still sidelined

Don't expect to hear **Gerry Callahan** on the radio any time soon. Off the air with a throat ailment since April 27, Callahan, choleric co host of WEEL's highly rated morning show, is not well enough to resume work, and there is no indication when he might be. "His voice is still relatively weak and hoarse," **Jason Wolfe**, the station's program director, said in an e - mail yesterday. Wolfe said Callahan is "making progress," but there is no timetable for his return.

### Guthrie caught again

**Arlo Guthrie's** up to his old tricks. Almost 42 years after his infamous arrest for littering in the Berkshires, the "Alice's Restaurant" singer has again been deemed a nuisance. Guthrie, 59, was summoned yesterday by the code enforcement board in Indian River County, on Florida's east coast, for using recreational vehicles illegally and creating a "public nuisance" by keeping an unsafe building. Guthrie and his wife, **Jackie**, still own a home in Western Massachusetts, not far from Stockbridge -- the setting of the singer's antiwar anthem, "Alice's Restaurant." The couple couldn't be reached yesterday for comment, and it's not known if the arrest will yield another song.

### It doesn't ad up

What's with the marketing campaign for the movie "Evening"? **Susan Minot** wrote the book, but the ads all say "from the author of 'The Hours,' " which was written by Provincetown's **Michael Cunningham**. Minot

swears she's not upset that Cunningham, with whom she co-wrote the screenplay for "Evening," is getting all the credit. "I am thrilled with the movie," Minot told Publishers Weekly. Of course she is. The movie starring **Claire Danes** has spurred renewed interest in the book, which means money in Minot's pocket.

#### Monkey in middle

Normally, the first-pitch duties at Fenway are handled by someone semi-famous, folks like **Carrie Underwood** or "**Judge Judy**" **Sheindlin**. Saturday, the Sox will try something a little different: A capuchin monkey will take the mound. But don't expect **Ayla** the ballplaying primate to reach home plate. "We don't want to encourage her to throw things," said **Sara Aitken** of Helping Hands: Monkey Helpers for the Disabled. "So it'll be more of a first drop." Ayla, in case you're wondering, is a full-blooded Bosox fan, born 20 years ago at the Southwick Zoo in Mendon .

Another Ayla, "American Idol" also-ran **Ayla Brown**, has had better days. The leggy lass from Wrentham reports that her MySpace page has been hacked, resulting in the loss of 4,000 friends and 100,000 song plays. "I have never been one to cry over spilled milk, what's done is done," the daughter of State Senator **Scott Brown** and Channel 5 reporter **Gail Huff** said in an e-mail. "Apparently hackers out there have nothing better to do than to destroy people's property . . . I refuse to let them get the better of me!" A finalist on "Idol" in '06, Brown has released a CD called "Forward."

Diaz tells Peru she's sorry

**Cameron Diaz** apologized for carrying a bag with a political slogan that evoked painful memories in Peru. The actress visited the Incan city of Machu Picchu in Peru's Andes on Friday carrying an olive-green bag emblazoned with a red star and the words "Serve the People" printed in Chinese, perhaps Chinese Communist leader Mao Zedong's most famous political slogan. The bags are marketed as fashion accessories in some world capitals, but in Peru the slogan evokes memories of the Maoist Shining Path insurgency that fought the government in the 1980s and early 1990s in a bloody conflict that left nearly 70,000 people dead. "I sincerely apologize to anyone I may have inadvertently offended," Diaz said in a statement. "The bag was a purchase I made as a tourist in China and I did not realize the potentially hurtful nature of the slogan printed on it." (AP)

Sizemore sentenced to 16 months in prison

**Tom Sizemore** was sentenced yesterday to 16 months in state prison by a Los Angeles judge who ruled the alleged discovery of methamphetamine in the actor's car had violated his probation in a previous drug case. Sizemore "has been in every program, and here he is again," Superior Court Judge **Cynthia Rayvis** said. He "abused the privilege of probation" and "needs to be in a lockdown setting," the judge said. Rayvis recommended Sizemore be sent to the R.J. Donovan Correctional Facility in San Diego County because of its noteworthy drug treatment program. Sizemore, 45, whose screen credits include "Saving Private Ryan" and "Black Hawk Down," didn't speak during the hearing. He wore orange jail clothing. Sizemore's lawyer, **Fay Arfa**, argued that prison wouldn't help her client overcome his problem and said after the ruling that Sizemore's legal team "will pursue our remedies on appeal." (AP)

Aguilera wants to act

**Christina Aguilera** (inset) says she's reading scripts in search of the right role to launch an acting career. "I am looking forward to moving into another form of what I feel is another creative outlet for me, and that would be acting," the 26-year-old singer told reporters yesterday in Shanghai, where she was to hold her first mainland China concert. A posh settlement?

**Victoria Beckham** accepted undisclosed damages yesterday in London from a celebrity magazine that claimed the crew of her US television show considered her "picky, demanding and rude." The former Spice Girl sued Star magazine over an April article that claimed staff working on the NBC show had also described her as "full of herself and not very nice." Beckham's lawyer, **Gerrard Tyrrell**, told Britain's High Court that filming hadn't started at the time the story was published. (AP)
